They are **not internet enabled** but still allow calls and texts. They are cheap to buy, too ([Amazon](#), [Argos](#)). No data needed for your SIM card. [ASDA mobile](#) sell these, for example.

What are the new school rules? How can I find out more?

School rules are changing. From September 2025, Year 6 pupils can continue to bring a smartphone to school, and hand them into the class teacher on arrival but we recommend brick phones. From September 2026, brick phones only are permitted to be stored at school.

What are Costello doing?

As a cluster school for Costello, we have been in conversation with Mr Conway about this matter to ensure a joined-up approach.

From September 2026 children will be encouraged to only bring a brick phone to school.

From September 2027 children will only be allowed a brick phone in school.
